The CHIP going forward...

It had previously been agreed to review the work of the CHIP. The four original programmes have come to an end and have been replaced with three new working groups.

Two of the working groups - Better Hearings and Policy, Scanning & Action have both met. Terms of reference are to be agreed shortly and work plans are currently being developed.

The third working group - Data, Evidence & Quality Improvement has been put on hold for the time being due to other areas addressing the main priorities of this work stream. This will be reviewed shortly.

June meeting – highlights

Year of Young People 2018 was discussed and there was agreement by CHIP members that 2018 should not be the only focus on young people, but that work should continue (as normal practice) to engage with young people when designing practice and policy.
