Agenda Item	Action Points
1. Welcome and apologies	
The Chair welcomed CHIP partners to the group, apologies were noted and brief introductions made by new partners.	
2. Minutes of Previous Meeting and Action Points	
Minutes of previous meeting have been agreed. The Chair agreed with the group that all actions are completed with the exception of AP2 where a further conversation is in diaries for BE and AH .	
3. Updates and Issues Paper	
GM introduced himself as the new lead for Our Hearings Our Voice (OHOV). members for SCRA. The young people have not had the same 1-2-1 support or group support over the last few months but are still committed to supporting the improvements. **GM** made a plea on how best to interact on partners work and several offers of meeting were made. Agreed to have a wider OHOV engagement discussion at next CHIP meeting,

TM advised that due to timings he was unable to provide a detailed update on impacts of winter Covid funding awards Those in receipt of the funding were not yet due to provide updates. He will be in a much better place to deliver CHIP partners an update paper in advance of June CHIP meeting.

BE raised the issue of children attending hearings without any children's plans. **AN** asked if we could give Social Work Scotland colleagues a chance to respond to **BE's** concerns and to build a broader understanding of the issues. **SO** has asked **BE** to provide an update on what local authorities were affected. **SO** has asked to meet with **BE** to discuss further. **NS** offered that this related to the previous Home CSO research and always a case to revisit however other matters had taken precedence over the last year. **LS** suggested that previous outputs should be reviewed and brought forward for a future meeting of CHIP.

HE currently evaluating the stability of the Teams platform and the connectivity of the participants, and what their experience was in relation to Vscene and would report back.

4. Immediate priorities for Children's Hearings Reform

LS discussed paper 4 and asked the wider group if this is what they expected to see, is there anything missing and does anyone have any other thoughts for priorities for 21/22.

TM has asked what partners want to do as individual agencies and their obligations under The Promise. **TM** confirmed he would be happy to have further conversations with partners over the next month to ensure we were ready to fully focus on the key priorities over June and there can be a solidifying of the plan of work following input on appointments of new Ministers.

NH provided an update on paper 5 which looks at Better Hearings and where this sits in the context in the changing landscape. CHIP members will recall the work that was undertaken through Better Hearings and the compendium of 10 years of research completed in 2016. He called for clarity around an affirmation of Better Hearings and OHOV outputs as reconciled with the Promise commitments on system design issues. The paper looks at how to start to integrate the existing

structure and energy sources that are already in place to render them fit for the future. **NH** has asked CHIP if they are willing to recommit to Better Hearings using some of the existing structures.

NH raised the main concern that if this is not started in the meantime the work could start to fragment and degrade, missing out on interagency connections which are crucial to Better Hearings. . Would like to keep the cross agency group going and have discussions with **FM** and The Promise team to come back with a proposal that deals with the longer term governance and system planning issues.

AP4: Bilateral discussions with Promise/ CHS/SCRA/SG

FM heartened to read the papers - crucial to engage with key partners to get prioritisation and sequencing right.

Overall agreement to revisit the papers and discussions in June and to commit to a continued cohesive partnership.

AP5 Priorities for Children's Hearings Reform on Agenda for June CHIP

5. CH Covid Recovery - Unidentified Demand

TM confirmed the CHCRG has been considering outstanding demand and deferred cases and how to work through them in regard to system and service recovery. The weekly recovery group are starting to take data sets on vulnerable children and families but the next stage is to better understand how these challenges or vulnerabilities might present as social work and other professionals have to make a reporter referral. **TM** will provide an update for the next meeting.

AP6: Further update to be provide at June CHIP

AN is aware alongside those hidden children and how to ensure the planning is responsive to that. There is an increasing concern about the pauses in permanence planning for the children further into that process and what those delays mean for change of placement and permanence recommendations going to court.

6. Advocacy in Hearings early reflection

PS updated CHIP that on 21st November 2020 advocacy regulations came into force. Between November and March work carried out to ensure all the organisations were prepared and ready for referrals and how to work with other practitioners within the Children's Hearings System. Advocacy providers vary from large national organisations across multiple local authorities to smaller organisations who are well established in a single local authority. An alternate provider is available in case of conflicts etc. The aim is for a child to be notified about advocacy as soon as possible. Social workers have been provided guidance on how to provide child and families on the offer of advocacy



and how to arrange. There has been a lot of work done with local authorities and practitioners to identify and resolve any early emerging practice and referral issues. LC is keen to explore the relationship between an advocacy worker and a solicitor and where potential cross-over of roles occur. TM thought it may be a good idea to have a discussion with BE, LC and TMcN to discuss this further and where practicable refine approaches. FM asked to be included. 7. Any Other Business	
IF provided a short update on YJIB from Liz Murdoch. YJIB does not meet again until 27 th May. CHIP partners were thanked for providing comments on the draft Youth Justice Vision. The plan is to launch at the annual Youth Justice Conference on 16 th -17 th June. This conference would be a big interest to CHIP members based on the 'Rights' theme of this year's conference.
